Introduction & Purpose

The Climate Investment Executive Training Program is a flagship initiative of the Global Climate Finance Centre (GCFC), delivered in partnership with NYUAD Stern, ADGM Academy, and TIL.

The program is designed to build practical capacity in climate and transition finance across emerging and developing markets, by targeting the next generation of decision-makers operating at the intersection of capital, climate, and development.

The program is designed as a hybrid of academic depth and applied learning, combining faculty-led training with practitioner insights and interactive components. Participants will engage with leading academics, investors, and policymakers, and explore real-world cases through structured discussions and simulations. The format is intended to strengthen both the theoretical foundation and practical skillset needed to mobilize climate capital effectively, particularly in emerging and developing markets.

Program Timeline (*Preliminary*)

- Official Announcement – Abu Dhabi Finance Week (December 2025)
- Follow-up Engagement – Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week (January 2026)
- Program Delivery – March 2026

Target Audience

The program is tailored for early- to mid-career professionals (approximately 3–7 years of experience) in climate-relevant financial roles across public and private sectors. Participants may come from:

- Commercial and development banks
- Sovereign wealth funds and asset managers
- Government ministries and public investment entities
- MDBs and DFIs
- Climate-focused startups, funds, and platforms
